



So what is the ECS at Stamford High School Dual Enrollment Program?

ECS at Stamford High School is designed to immerse motivated learners in a rigorous program that will not only provide a high school diploma, but also the opportunity to work towards a technology focused associate degree through Norwalk Community College. The foundation of this program will be focused on learning innovative technology, and 21st Century Skills development, that will directly prepare students for college and career success upon graduation. Students successfully completing the program will be afforded the opportunity to continue their studies at NCC apply to 4-year colleges and universities or go directly into the workplace.

Norwalk Community College (NCC)

NCC is a public, two-year, associate degree granting, co-educational, non-residential college, offering more than 100 accredited programs leading to associate degrees or professional certification. The College offers an enriching educational experience for degree-seeking students and those who are committed to lifelong learning.



Stamford Public Schools (SPS)

Through the support of designated teachers, students will complete all high school graduation requirements while concentrating on technology and workplace learning. In addition, a program director, school counselors, SPEF mentors and college faculty will provide support to all students.

Stamford Public Education Foundation (SPEF)

SPEF will provide professional mentors to all students in the Stamford Dual Enrollment Program. Mentors will support students through the workplace learning curriculum, the development of 21st Century Skills and off-site retreats/experiences.

Beyond Limits Academic Program (BLAP)

The great staff at BLAP will provide a 2-week summer program for all 9th and 10th grade students in ECS. This program will introduce students to the SHS facility, acclimate ECS students to the Google Classroom platform and Chromebook. Lunch and transportation to and from the program will be provided.

Mayor's Youth Employment Program (MYEP)

The Mayor's Youth Employment Program serves as the liaison between SPS students and internship programs at a variety of community organizations and job sites. Students that successfully complete 3 years of workplace learning will be eligible for an internship in the community.
